Report of Student Satisfaction Survey (2019-20)

Students of an institution form the core of the stakeholders and all the activities undertaken by the institute are focused on creating a barrier free and conducive environment for excelling in their academics. In this regard Rabindranath Thakur Mahavidyalaya puts in sincere efforts to fulfill the needs of the students of this college and provides many facilities for the benefit of its students. Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is one of the mandatory criteria set by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and the college also feels it is necessary to elicit perceptions and opinions of the students who are the foremost stakeholders and identify the deviations if any, to improve the system and hence this survey is carried on to know the strength and improvement areas from the point of view of the students on infrastructure and learning experience.

The survey is conducted and reported by Internal Quality Assessment Cell (IQAC) with support of the

Principal and the Heads of all the Departments. The questionnaires were prepared in Google form and circulated to all the departments and then to students. Total 399 students participated in this online survey in which male students were 54% and female students were 46%.




- 1. Monthly meetings of each Department will be arranged in which coverage of syllabus and teachers' plan will be discussed.




1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?




3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?












